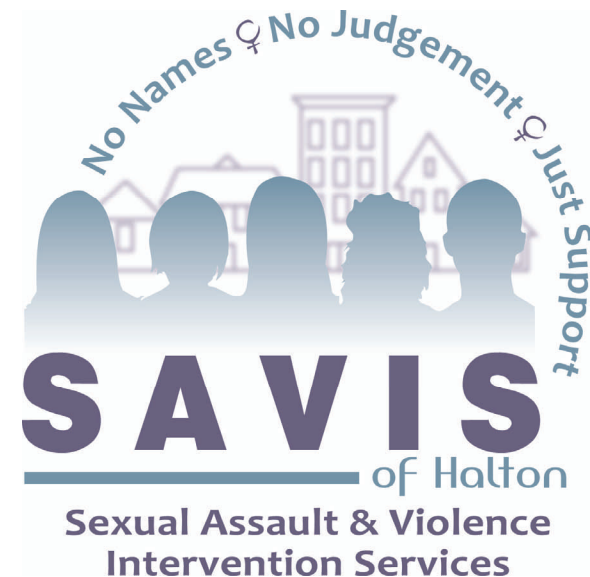

## Consent: Saying Yes to Sexual Activity

## What is Consent?:

### Consent means



- Consent means agreeing to sexual activity — for example, kissing, touching, intercourse — with another person
- Consent is voluntary
- In Canada, you must be 16 years old or older to Consent to sexual activity
- Even if you Consent to sexual activity, you can still change your mind (decide you want to stop)

**Without permission  
(consent),  
it is  
Sexual Assault.**

## Some Examples of No Consent!

You are too scared  
to say No.



You are tricked,  
bullied or  
threatened  
until you say  
Yes.



You are drunk  
or high.



The other person is a family  
member — for example,  
father, aunt, grandfather,  
cousin.

Or the other person is a  
professional — for example,  
teacher, doctor, interpreter —  
employed to help you.

## Need Help? If yes, you can:

- Tell someone you trust: friend, teacher, doctor, nurse, relative, counsellor, SAVIS
- Go to the hospital.
- See a doctor or go to a clinic
- Call the police. *Do not bathe or shower if you are reporting sexual assault.*
